S.F. No. 228: A bill for an act relating to education; appropriating money for school district energy costs.

Page 1, line 6, delete "January 31" and insert "February 28"

Page 2, after line 3, insert:

"Subd. 6. [PAYMENT ADJUSTMENT.] By January 31, 2002, the department of children, families, and learning shall certify the actual heating fuel costs for school facilities and the fuel costs for transporting students for each school district for the 2000-2001 school year and recalculate the school district reimbursement amount, under subdivision 4, based on actual costs. The department of children, families, and learning, shall adjust general education aid paid to school districts for fiscal year 2003 by the amount of the difference between the estimated calculation and the actual costs."

Page 2, line 10, after the period, insert "Of this amount, the department may retain up to \$30,000 for the administration of this program."

And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on Finance. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.
