

**COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED SUBSEQUENT TO ADJOURNMENT****MESSAGES FROM THE HOUSE**

Madam President:

I have the honor to announce that the House has adopted the recommendation and report of the Conference Committee on Senate File No. 888, and repassed said bill in accordance with the report of the Committee, so adopted.

**S.F. Last year, I vetoed legislation on this subject. I came to this decision primarily because the Minnesota State Lottery, in modernizing its operations and making games it sells in paper for available in new ways, did so to increase revenues for initiatives that support all Minnesotans.

I continue to believe limiting the Lottery's ability to continue these initiatives will result in less funding for education, transportation, park, hunting and fishing programs, and programs to protect and preserve our environment. However, I note that the bill again passed both bodies of the legislature by overwhelming majorities.

Therefore, I have decided that I do not wish to sign this bill into law, with the understanding that it will become law without my signature. Accordingly, I will deposit, without signature, in the office of the Secretary of State, Chapter 45, S.F. No. 229.
