Pursuant to Rule 45, the Committee on Rules and Administration recommends that H.F. No. 653 be amended as follows:

Delete all the language after the enacting clause of H.F. No. 653, the second engrossment; and insert the language after the enacting clause of S.F. No. 836, the first engrossment; further, delete the title of H.F. No. 653, the second engrossment; and insert the title of S.F. No. 836, the first engrossment.

And when so amended H.F. No. 653 will be identical to S.F. No. 836, and further recommends that H.F. No. 653 be given its second reading and substituted for S.F. No. 836, and that the Senate File be indefinitely postponed.
